

Reading: 1 Samuel 7:7 - 14

Introduction

- For 20 years Israel had been in a bad place of their own making.
- They had turned away from God and the hand of the oppressing Philistines was against them.
- Three times in the chapter the term 'the hand of the Philistines' is used.
 [Vs 3, 8 & 14].
- Against this backdrop Samuel emerges as a catalyst for revival.

1 Defeating Your Philistines

- Every Christian has 'Philistines' in their experience.
- The Philistines of temptation, guilt, personal weakness, doubts, fears, trials and troubles.
- In [Ch 4] when Israel had previously locked horns with the Philistines they
 were 'hammered.'
- But that had been at a time of disobedience to God on their part.
- Now in [Ch 7] they have repented and Samuel is fighting the battle on his knees. Notice the difference.
- Question: How do I defeat my Philistines?
- Obedience to the Lord. [15:22].
- Prayer to the Lord.

- Get your 'Big Brother' involved in those 'bullying' you and 'picking' on you.
- Ask Him for His help.
- Stop depending on the help you bring to the table. Its His help that wins the battle.

2 The Lord Is Your Helper

- Consider [vs 12] of our reading.
- Ebenezar had been the place of defeat in [Ch. 4] but now Samuel calls this place of victory, 'Ebenezer.'
- Consider [Psalm 54:4], [Psalm 121:1] and [Hebrews 13:5 and 6].

3 The Holy Spirit Is Your Helper

- In the 'Upper Room Discourse' in [John 14 ~ 16] Jesus speaks about'the
 Helper' who is the Holy Spirit.
- The word 'Helper' comes from Greek word 'parakletos' meaning 'one called alongside us to help.'
- Consider [John 14:16, 14:25, 15:26 and 16:7].
- After Christ's ascension and exaltation, the Father poured out the Holy Spirit at Pentecost.
- When a person gets saved the Holy Spirit comes WITHIN effecting the work of salvation.
- The Holy Spirit has a 2nd distinct work when He comes upon us to anoint/equip, empower us.
- The coming of the Holy Spirit **UPON** is the baptism with the Holy Spirit. [Acts 1:8].
- Occurred in [Acts 2] (Jerusalem), [Acts 8] (Samaria), [Acts 10], (Caesarea) and [Acts 19] at (Ephesus).
- NB. Every believer needs TWO baptisms.
- Baptised in water and baptised in the Holy Spirit.
- [Acts 19:2] "Have you received the Holy Spirit since you believed?"
- The Holy Spirit is our 'Ebenezer.'
