

Reading: 1 Samuel 3: 1 - 10

Introduction

- [Vs 1] "The Word of the Lord was rare (scarce) in those days."
- 'These days' were the days of Israel's 'iron age.'
- · The words of people were plentiful but the Word of the Lord was 'rare.'
- There was a spiritual famine in the land. [Amos 8:11].
- There is a spiritual famine in our nation today.
- Everything but the Word of the Lord being presented.
- · 'Churches are starving spiritually while overdosing on entertainment.'
- The minister's task is to feed the sheep and fish for souls, **NOT** to entertain goats.
- [Ruth 1:6] We want the Lord to visit His people in giving them bread.

1 The Call Of Samuel

- Samuel was approximately 12 years of age at this time.
- Eli is almost blind. He was also blind spiritually.
- Just before dawn Jehovah called Samuel's name.
- · Samuel mistook God's voice for Eli's.
- It took the experience of Eli to let Samuel know what was really happening.
- Youthfulness is good but it needs the experience of those who are older.
- Eli teaches Samuel his first prayer. [Vs 9].
- The 4th time God appears in a 'theophany' and stands in Samuel's room.

2 The Presence And Voice Of God

- Both the voice and the presence of God are REAL.
- God's presence left the holy of holies and by-passed the chambers of Eli and his sons to a child's room.
- If God can't find a man to use. He will find and visit a child.
- Seek the presence of God for yourself and to hear God's voice to you. [Jeremiah 29:12-14].

3 Does God Still Speak Today? Yes

- How does God speak to us today?
- Through dreams/visions. [Acts 2:17/18].
- Through a prophetic utterance.
- · Through our conscience.
- God speaks to us primarily through His Word.

4 Samuel's First Prayer

- · 'Speak for your servant hears.'
- Maybe God is waiting for you to pray this prayer to Him.
