## Reading: Luke 19:11 - 27

#### Introduction

- In the light of the coming again of Christ we are answering the question Peter puts in [2 Peter 3:11].
- Recap: We need to be READY, WATCHFUL, HOLY and GODLY.

#### 1 The Parable Of The Pounds & Minas

- This parable is unique to Dr Luke but there are similarities with the parable of the **TALENTS** in [Matthew 25].
- Many parables highlight the return of Jesus.
- The parable tells us about those who are awaiting His return and about their service in His absence.
- [VS 12]. In this parable Jesus represented by a 'nobleman.'
- 'The far country' is heaven.
- [Vs 13]. The 10 servants represent those who would identify Jesus as their Lord/ Master.
- A mina is equivalent to 3 months' salary.

#### 2 Stewardship

- Everything we have/own we have it on loan from the 'nobleman.'
- He expects us to make good use of it. We are to put His capitol to use.
- The minas/pounds are to enable us to be about 'our Father's business.' [Luke 2:49].

# 3 Anarchy And Rebellion

• [Vs 14]. The cry of anarchy, rebellion and mutiny. The world's 'mission statement.'

### 4 The Returning Nobleman

- [Vs 15] The 'Nobleman' returns.
- No one on earth or in hell will prevent this. 'I shall return.'

# 5 A Future Reckoning

- [Vs 15]. The return of the Nobleman will be a time of **RECKONING** for His servants.
- This theme occurs in the parable of the talents also.
- The term 'settled accounts' is an accountants term dealing with losses, gains and profits.
- Consider [Romans 14:10, 12] and [2 Corinthians 5:10].
- In the ancient world the 'Bema seat' was were citizens were rewarded and disputes settled. [Acts 18:12].
- Every Christian has an appointment to keep at 'the judgement seat of Christ.'
- It is **NOT** ours sins to be accounted for but our service/stewardship.
- 'What On Earth Did You Do For Heaven's Sake?'

# 6 Rewards, Excuses And Consequences

- The 'Bema Seat' is primarily a place of REWARD.
- Faithfulness is rewarded with *'well done good and faithful servant, enter into the joy of your Lord.'*
- The 'well done' is also issued in the parable of the pounds/minas.
- The reward for the faithful believer:
- **NB** There are degrees of reward in heaven.
- J.C. Ryle, 'our good things are not of this world.'
- **NB** The exposure of the unfaithful/lazy servant at the last day.
- NB laziness is wickedness.
- NB [vs 21 23] The uselessness of *'excuses on that day.'* Better if they'd never been born.
